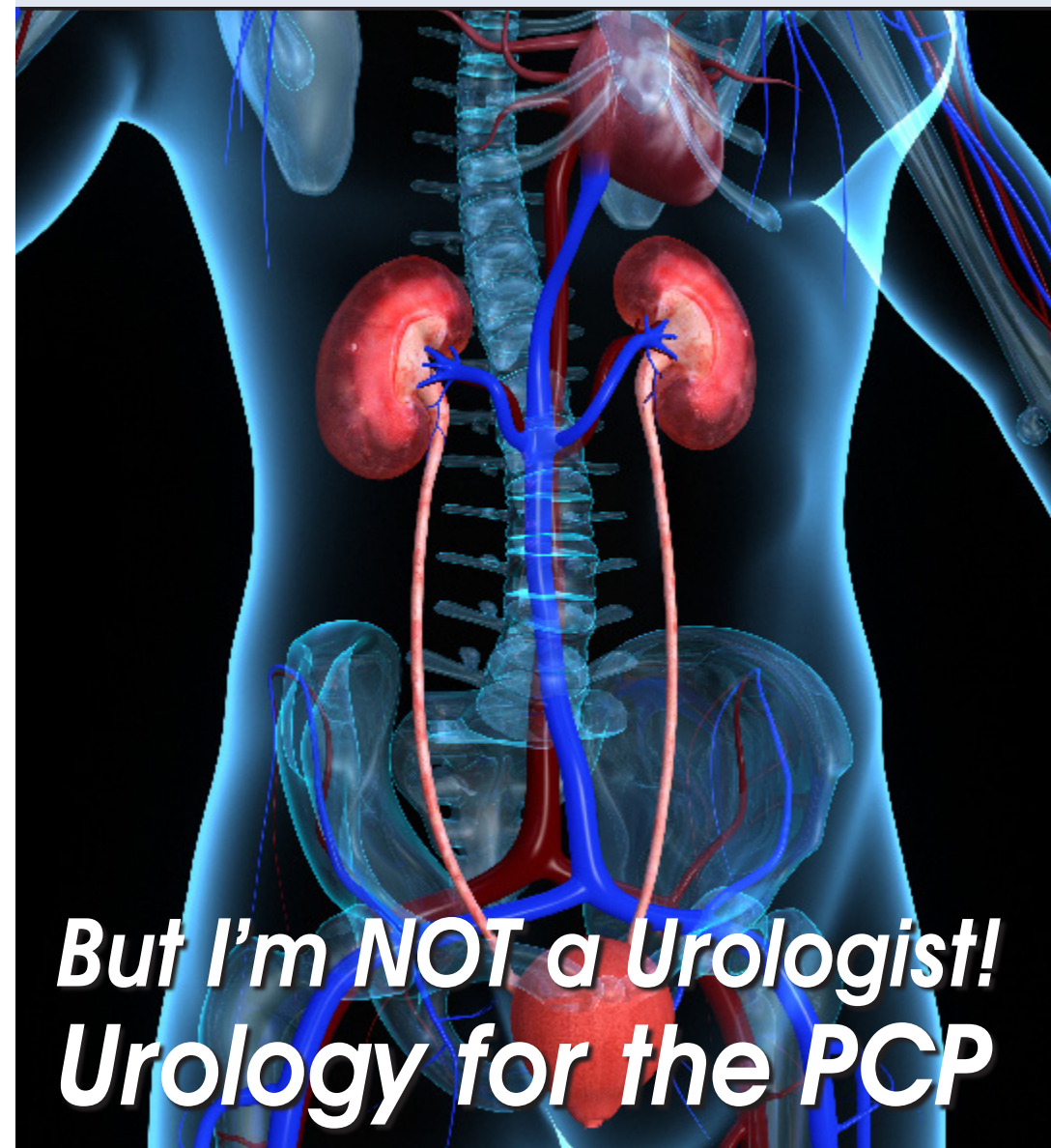

Course Description

Urology Centers of Alabama is offering continuing education through the Medical Association of the State of Alabama. This continuing medical education meeting is designed to provide physicians and other healthcare staff with a practical and timely overview of the important developments in the care of urology patients. The format will be an overview of the disease state and presentation on current standard of care for diagnosis and treatment. A spectrum of urology topics will be discussed. Adequate time after each set of lectures will permit panel discussion, as well as, opportunity for questions and comments from the audience.

Objectives

- 1) Determine what first-line medical therapies are available for the treatment of BPH.
- 2) Distinguish how the Primary Care physician can effectively initiate the work-up in the patient suspected of having a kidney stone.
- 3) Be ready to manage, with appropriate pain medication and a strategy to aid passage of the stone, the uncomplicated kidney stone patient.
- 4) Analyze the pathophysiology of Peyronie's Disease.
- 5) Be able to distinguish between urgency and stress incontinence, and be able to use medical treatment when indicated.
- 6) Be readily able to discuss female sexual dysfunction and readily able to refer these patients to the appropriate specialist.
- 7) Analyze the characteristics that define a quality and outcomes based erectile dysfunction/men's sexual health clinic.
- 8) Be competent in the initial workup of hematuria.
- 9) Be aware of the advances in and the improved outcomes associated with urologic robotic surgery.
- 10) Assess the appropriate components of prostate cancer screening.
- 11) Be aware of the emerging use of MRI in the diagnosis of prostate cancer.
- 12) Determine how the changing healthcare landscape may affect the ways Primary Care providers manage the patient who presents with a urologic health concern.
- 13) Form a collegial connection with a UCA physician(s) who can serve as a ready contact for questions that might arise in your practice.

Target Audience

This educational activity is designed for physicians who treat and manage patients with Urology issues. This includes those who specialize in family medicine and OB/GYN. Also encouraged to attend are nurse practitioners, registered nurses, and physician assistants. If interested, allied health professionals and industry representatives are welcome to attend the educational activity.
